## 2026 HonorBridge Pause to Give Life

April 1, 2026

**9:50 a.m. Gather at the flagpole and quick introduction.**

Good morning. On behalf of (Hospital name and HonorBridge), I want to thank you for joining us as we Pause to Give Life and celebrate April as National Donate Life Month. I am (NAME, TITLE).

In just a few minutes, at 10:08, we will be among other participating hospitals across the HonorBridge service area that will raise a Donate Life flag. The flag-raising honors donors, their families, those who are waiting, and recipients who received the gift of life and celebrate what Donate Life Month means. The time of 10:08 signifies that one donor can save eight lives.

In 2006, The Donate Life flag became a national symbol of unity, remembrance, and hope while honoring those touched by donation and transplantation. During the past 20 years, over 50,000 Donate Life Flags have flown across America.

Once we raise our flag, we will observe a moment of silence for 30 seconds to recognize the over 4,000 patients waiting for a lifesaving transplant in NC.

This morning, we recognize the strength and courage of those waiting. We honor the hundreds of North Carolina donors and donor families that have so selflessly given the gift of life and healing through organ, eye, and tissue donation.

In 2025, HonorBridge recovered 1,155 organs from deceased donors, enabling the transplantation of 906 organs which saved 789 lives. In addition to advancing transplantation science by recovering 231 organs for research, HonorBridge recovered 2,986 tissues from 1,517 generous tissue donors.

Yet, more must be done. Today, over 100,000 men, women, and children are waiting for lifesaving organ transplants across our country, and as mentioned before, over 4,000 of those waiting live in North Carolina.

We ask you to help us continue educating our fellow North Carolinians about the need for more registered organ, eye, and tissue donors. April is Donate Life Month and an excellent time to remember this vital work.

So, throughout April, please make it your mission to speak to at least one person about registering their decision to become an organ, eye, and tissue donor. They can say yes to donation at the DMV and obtain a red heart on their driver's license, sign up online at [honorbridge.org/registerme](https://honorbridge.org/registerme), or sign up via the Health app on their Apple device. And remind them, once registered, to share their decision with loved ones.
